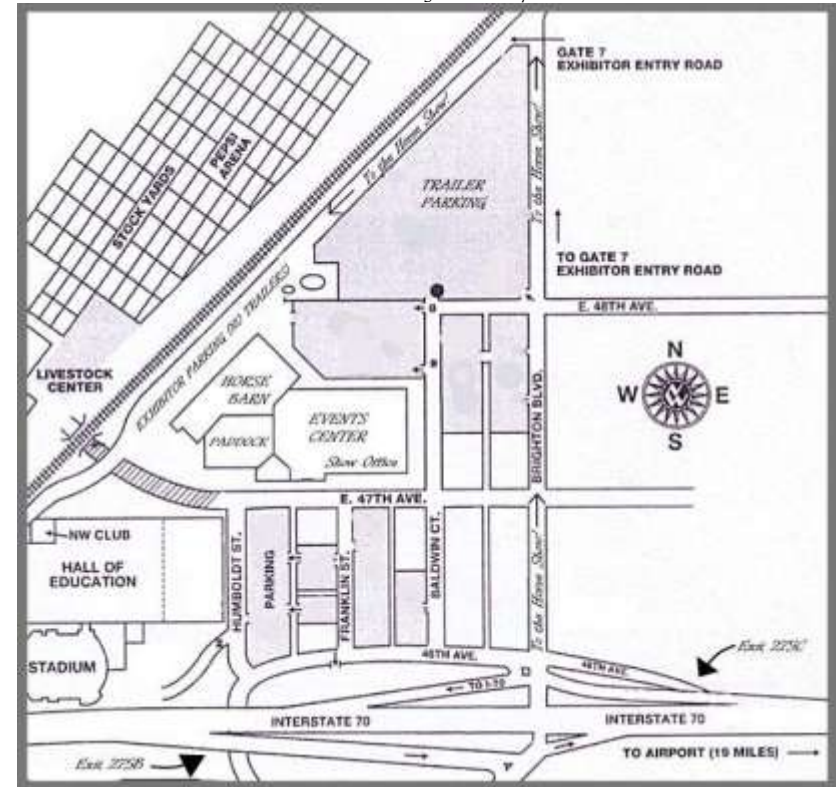

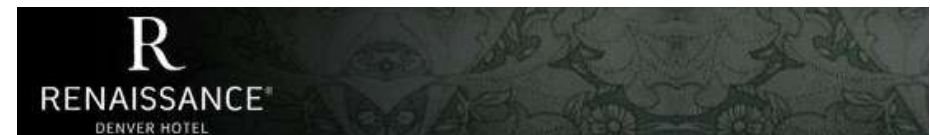

Rules and Regulations

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Any changes appearing in the 2011 Rule Book automatically become a part of this premium list. Check your Federation Rule Book for class specifications regarding your breed and classes. In case of error in the book, the tentative schedule numbering will be the guideline.

Entries

Entries must be made in writing and signed by the (1) exhibitor (2) the rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur, (3) the trainer, and (4) the coach, if applicable, or by the agent(s) of such person(s) and must be accompanied by funds to cover entry fees, stall fees and Federation fee (see GR208.1). In the case of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longer under 18, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, the trainer, must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. Or: by transmitting the required entry data to a designated collection agent via the internet, accompanied by a valid credit card payment to cover entry fees, stall fees, Federation fee (see GR208.1) and applicable processing fees, and including the name(s) of the (1) exhibitor, (2) rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur, (3) the trainer, and (4) the coach, if applicable. The secretary of the competition will accept such an entry as complete. In the case of on-line entries, no competition number will be issued until the Competition Secretary has received on an entry form, the signatures of the (1) exhibitor, (2) the rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur, (3) the trainer, and (4) the coach, if applicable, or of the agent(s) of such person(s). In the case of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur under 18, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, the trainer must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF OWNER MUST BE ON ENTRY BLANK.

Entries received without remittance in full will NOT be processed.

Entries that are NOT complete will be returned and considered Post Entries.

Post Entries

POST ENTRIES ARE ANY ENTRIES MADE AFTER THE ADVERTISED CLOSING DATE OF MAY 21, 2011. Post entries can only be accepted prior to an hour before the start of the session in which the class is held. Any entry received after the closing date of MAY 21, 2011 will be considered a post entry and will be accepted, at the discretion of the Horse Show Management, with an additional charge of \$30 PER HORSE, payment in full (or a signed, blank check made payable to UPHA) AND a fully completed and signed Entry Blank.

Personal Checks

Any check refused by the bank for any reason will be assessed a \$30.00 penalty. Then the full obligation, plus the \$30.00 penalty, must be covered by a money order, cashier's check or cash (NOTE! paybacks will NOT be issued for horses/entries included on the returned check. The Show Secretary will use discretion in cashing exhibitors' personal checks. ALL CHECKS MUST BE PRE-PRINTED WITH THE CURRENT INFORMATION (name, address and telephone number).

Refunds and Vet-outs

Entries will be accepted through midnight May 21, 2011. Exhibitors canceling their entries after the official date for the closing of entries, without a veterinarian's certificate, shall forfeit all fees. Vet-outs made prior to June 17, 2011 (the start of the show), with a veterinarian's certificate, shall forfeit only the office fee and stall fees. Vet-outs made during the show (June 17, 2011 or later), with a veterinarian's certificate, shall forfeit all fees with the exception of entry fees. No refunds will be made during the show. The competition will refund entry fees in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency.

**Stalls**

Stalls will be assigned by the Barn Manager with preference given to properly completed entries submitted by the May 21 closing date. Out-of-town and out-of-state exhibitors will be given preference if they have entries in by the closing date. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls and no change will be permitted without the consent of the Horse Show Management. Stalls are constructed of wood, metal and/or vinyl with either half-open, pipe or solid fronts and doors. Exhibitors should order only the actual number of stalls required, and only one stall per entered horse on which fees are paid will be allocated.

Exhibitors will be charged for any additional stalls used without the permission of the Horse Show Management. Because the National Western charges the Almost Summer Horse Show for each stall used, this will be continuously monitored throughout the show. Stall usage includes but is not limited to: using stalls for hay, straw and bedding storage, storing clothing or tack, and storage of garbage, waste or manure.

Stalls will not be available until 9:00am on Thursday, June 17, 2011. Out-of-state horses may be granted early entry; please contact the Barn Manager for arrangements. There will be a \$15 per-day, per-stall fee added for early entry. Stall charts will be posted. Any changes of entries after the closing date will be subject to management's approval and subject to a first-come/first-served basis. There is a \$40 Grounds Fee per non-stalled horse. No first bedding is supplied. Exhibitors and horses must be off the premises by noon on Monday, June 21, 2011.

Exhibitors will be billed for damage to stalls in excess of normal wear and tear. Removal of stall panels by exhibitors is prohibited. Exhibitors desiring removal of stall panels must contact the Barn Manager, who will coordinate the removal with National Western. Only National Western can remove these panels. The Almost Summer Horse Show will charge \$50 per panel for such removal and the exhibitor is responsible for payment.

All exhibitors are required to dump manure in designated areas. If not strictly adhered to, the Horse Show Management has the right to request any exhibitor to vacate show grounds. The Horse Show Management will strictly enforce this rule.

Stalls in the Events Center stabling area are limited so please send in your entries early. For those exhibitors wishing to stall together, please send entries to together to avoid any office oversights.

Feed and Bedding

No bedding is provided. Bedding, hay or grain may be obtained from the Feed Proprietor selling these items at the show, but it is suggested that you bring your own or make arrangements in advance with the Feed Proprietor (B&T Tack & Feed/Bill Amen – 303.809.6352). Shavings: \$8.00/bale. Exhibitors are responsible for payment and at no time will the Almost Summer Horse Show management be responsible for payment.

Protective Headgear

Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

Federation Classes

No Federation Medal Classes, Federation Equitation Classes or USEF/USDF Qualifying Classes are offered.

Measurements

Please contact the show office for measurement scheduling.

**Pets – IMPORTANT USEF RULE!**

Dogs are not allowed on the National Western grounds and may be impounded. Additionally, the 2011 USEF Rule Book states: **Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on leashes while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty, as well as issuance of warning cards.**

Conduct

Be warned that any act of discourtesy, foul language, or disobedience to the officials on the part of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer or family, friends or associates of the exhibitor of any horse will disqualify such horse from adjudication and the owner shall forfeit entrance and all fees.

Health Requirements

All out-of-state horses are to be examined by a licensed veterinarian and found to be free of any infectious or communicable diseases, and such information must be properly recorded on a health certificate accompanying each horse. It is recommended that horses be given influenza boosters before arriving at the horse show. For entry into the State of Colorado, a Coggins test is required.

Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Almost Summer Horse Show Rule

All exhibitors shall have as much fun as humanly or equinely possible. For those exhibitors who have read and understand this rule, please visit the horse show office and tell the staff you've read and understand this rule. This will prove to the staff that you have actually read your premium book – and you will win a small (but very fun) prize.

USEF Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) headline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

*For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$15 Federation fee will be collected (\$7 shall be an Equine Drugs and Medication fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; see GR407.1, .2 and .3). Exception: Horses entered in classes exempted from the Equine Drugs and Medication fee are also exempt from the balance of the Federation fee.

■ Awards

Prize money will be paid by check, made to the order of the person identified on the entry form, and will be mailed within thirty days of the completion of the show. No payback in Regular classes, Academy, Equitation, or Walk & Trot.

■ Office and Exercise Schedules

Schedules for Horse Show Office hours and exercising times will be posted at the Show Secretary's office.



■ Condition of Entry

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Almost Summer Horse Show Management. Neither the Almost Summer Horse Show, the Horse Show Management, nor the Girl Scouts Mile Hi Council will in any case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it is a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold such bodies harmless for any loss or accident to horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The Almost Summer Horse Show, the Horse Show Management, and Praying Hands Ranch will not be responsible or liable for any injury or death in any way by exhibitors, spectators or employees.

WARNING: Under Colorado law, an equine professional is not liable for any injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Section 13.21.119, Colorado Revised Statutes.

■ Protests

Any rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, exhibitor, owner, agent, trainer or the parent of a junior exhibitor may file a protest with the Horse Show Committee or the Federation Hearing Committee alleging violation of any Federation rule(s) ... [and can be] received by the steward, technical delegate, a member of the Horse Show Committee, the Competition Manager or the Competition Secretary within 48 hours of the alleged violation, or if made directly to the Hearing Committee, it must be received at the Federation office by the fifth business day following the last recognized day of the competition, or by the fifth business day following the date on which the alleged violation occurred if it occurred other than at a competition.

■ Scheduling

The management of the Almost Summer Horse Show reserves the right to add, split, combine or cancel any classes. Classes with less than five entries may be withdrawn from the program at the discretion of the Horse Show Management. Juvenile, Academy and Equitation classes with four or fewer entries may be combined. Medal classes that do not have the required number of entries to be complete may be canceled.

■ Ring Procedure

The show ring will be under the absolute control of the Horse Show Manager. All horses must be ready and waiting to enter the ring promptly. The in-gate must be closed two (2) minutes after the first horse enters the ring. When the gates are closed and the judge has started to work, no exhibitor who is late will be admitted. During the time of the judging, no person will be allowed in the ring except attendants, judges, stewards, and when necessary, grooms of the horses to be judged.

It is a tradition of the competition ring that exhibitors be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and horses properly presented. The Management may, at its discretion, bar an entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

■ Arena and Warm-up Arena

The main arena measures 150' x 300'. The warm-up/paddock measures 90' x 190'. Both arenas have footing composed of 60% sand and 40% non-fat soluble clay.

■ Parking and Trailers

Due to fire regulations, cars, trailers, vans and campers must be parked in designated parking areas. Anyone wishing hookups for campers and/or trailers must arrange for this hookup in the horse show office and will be charged a hookup fee. **TRAILERS PARKED BEHIND THE PADDOCK AREA WILL BE TOWED. All trailers must be parked in Lot D or Lot H.** All vehicles in violation will be towed at the owners' expense.



Federation Entry Agreement

I have read the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") Entry Agreement (GR906.4) as printed in the Prize List for Colorado Classic Horse Show ("Competition") and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to Federation Rules, the Prize List, and local rules of the competition. I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos from the competition, and agree that any actions against the Federation must be brought in New York State.

The complete statement is as follows:

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

United States Equestrian Federation Membership Rules

1. To be eligible to participate as a rider, driver, handler, vaulteur, longeur, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, Dressage Competitions, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Endurance Rides, Reining Competitions, ParaEquestrian Competitions, and Vaulting Competitions, persons must be Members of the Federation as provided in Bylaw 201.

2. All Life, Senior Active and Junior Active Members of the Federation must designate a primary breed/discipline affiliation upon joining or must do so annually upon renewing. A member will be deemed to continue his or her primary designation unless prior to the record date (November 30 of each year) such Life Member notifies the Federation in writing of change. This shall be considered the member's affiliation for the purpose of allocating Voting Director seats as provided in Bylaw 211. Please refer to USEF Rule Book GR202 in its entirety for complete member and non-member requirements.

Amateur Certification

Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. This certification must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such certification provided by the Federation. Forms may be obtained from the Federation. Certification will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. A copy of card must accompany entry.

NEW FOR 2011!

USEF Announces the USEF Cup Incentive Program as Pilot for 2011

United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) is offering exhibitors in the Morgan and Saddlebred Divisions the opportunity to take part in a pilot program that will provide an annual incentive award of \$1,000 given to the owners of the top horse that competes at USEF competitions.

In order for individuals to be eligible for this new incentive program, they must be a USEF member and record their horse (annual or life) with USEF prior to competing at any competitions offering the USEF Cup designation. A horse can only earn points in the division in which it competes. All classes in each Division/Section (not just classes offered for Horse of the Year; exception: Equitation) will count toward points for this award.

POINTS* WILL BE ACCRUED AS FOLLOWS IN ALL CLASSES AT SHOWS WITH THE USEF CUP COMPETITION DESIGNATION
